As parents, we all want our children to grow up to be happy, healthy and successful. There are more challenges today for both parents and especially children than ever before and these challenges are having an effect on us all. The mental health statistics in Australia tell a very sad story. One in 5 Australians on an annual basis has a mental health issue with 75% of those incidences starting during adolescence and suicide, which is typically a symptom of depression, is the biggest killer of young Australians. If we are to change these statistics for ourselves and more importantly our children we need to understand all of the causes of mental illness and what we can do to help ourselves and those that we love.

On 12 November the school will host the Sam Project, who will be giving a mental health presentation at 7.00pm, where all of these issues will be addressed. Please save the date and time so you can attend. There will be more information published as we get closer to the event.
