Australia Indonesia sahabat lama Australia and Indonesia are old friends

Australia and Indonesia have been friends since the 1600's when Macassan fishermen from Sulawesi began a long relationship with the Yolngu people of Arnhem land.

Australia supported Indonesia's fight for independence from the Dutch. During this conflict, when Dutch ships carrying guns and ammunition tried to dock in Australian harbours, our waterside workers refused to service them.

The ongoing goal of schools, with parents, grandparents and the community is to prepare our students for their life beyond school. Our mission here at Scotts Head Public is to educate future generations through relevant and authentic learning experiences with Asia in social, cultural, political and economic spheres.

This intercultural understanding assists our young people to become responsible local and global citizens, equipping them through their education for living and working in an interconnected world and developing language skills and enhancing our students' knowledge, understanding and acceptance of Asian societies, cultures and environments.

Our mission is to provide a substantive pathway for the study of Indonesia language from Kindergarten to HSC. In 2017, there were 77,150 HSC graduates and only 192 students across the state completed Indonesian. This equates to a 0.25% participation rate.

In the last two years our student graduates attending Macksville High School have had the opportunity of an extension program in Year 7. This has led to this year a select class of 25 students in year 8, choosing to continue their Indonesia language studies. Outstanding results strongly supporting our vision of an Australia with more people who can engage with Indonesia for our mutual benefit.

Thanks to our previous Principal Mrs Angela Evans, who introduced this unique program to our school. Thanks to the families who continue to support this program, as we support students to engage with our nearest neighbours. Thanks to all the families that cooked and prepared an amazing feast on Friday. Thanks to all the families that helped in cleaning up. Great teamwork!

Obviously it was the indigenous people. Miklo Jarrett will trace the movement of the aboriginal people from northern to southern Australia. He will tell us lots about the Ngaambaa people, a sub-tribe of the Gumbaynggirr . The Ngaambaa settled our peninsula.

And needless to say he will regale us with Dreamtime stories as well as teaching us more Gumbaynggirr

Then Carollinne Rhodes who has written 6 books on the history of the Nambucca Valley will tell us about the first white men into the valley, namely the cedar cutters and the man who bought the cedar, Captain Scott.

When? Thursday 6 June Starting time? 6 pm for a meal

7 pm for the talks, finishing at 8.30 pm

Menu? An "aussie" themed dinner, incorporating some local bush tucker and local ingredients into dishes to honour the first people who cared for this wonderful Gumbaynggirr land.

It will also include some early settler favourites - pumpkin soup and a traditional roast
