Principal's Column

Hello, Giinagay, Hai,

Scotts Head Public School is the one and only Indonesian Bilingual school in New South Wales. Students are educated across various subjects using the Indonesian language and a methodology called Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL). The program has been running at the school since 2009 and is now extending into Macksville High School in order to achieve the vision of the program: an Australia with more people who can engage with Indonesia for our mutual benefit.

The trend in NSW and other states is a downward shift in language learning, except for W.A. where students are now mandated to learn a language from Year 3 up. NSW has much work to do in this area. In 2017, there were 77,150 HSC graduates. From that total only 192 students across the state completed Indonesian. This equates to a 0.25% participation rate.

Scotts Head Public School's mission is to educate our future generations in both Indonesian language and culture through relevant and authentic learning experiences.

Following up the recent visit by the Consul General, Pak Heru to Scotts Head Public School a letter of support from Consul General Heru Subolo has been received and is attached at the end of this newsletter. Outstanding feedback.

Next week is our end of term assembly on Tuesday 2 July, in the LLLCC. It is always wonderful to have parents, grandparents and community members join us to celebrate the students' achievements during Term 2. From 1.00- 1.30 is the awards, certificates and medals for the cross country, with a special presentation to the SRC from Heyden Lane, Coastal Community Recycling. Between 2-3 pm the students will have the opportunity to 'show off' some of their favourite performances.

Please come along and celebrate the achievements of a highly successful term 2.

This Friday is our schools athletic carnival. Please come along and cheer your child along. If due to the weather that the carnival will need to be rescheduled, we will put a notice out on our Facebook page, re the changes and the students will come to school.








In my capacity as the Consul General of the Republic of Indonesia in Sydney, covering the states of New South Wales, Queensland, and South Australia, I am writing to you to express my support for the Scotts Head Public School in Scotts Head, New South Wales in relation to its ongoing Indonesian Bilingual Program

On the 24th of May, 2019 I visited the Scotts Head Public School (SHPS) under the flagship program of Indonesia Goes to School program organized by my office. Secondly, being the only Indonesian bilingual school in the whole of NSW, the SHPS has been contributing to the implementation of the newly declared Indonesia Australia Comprehensive Strategy Partnership, in which one of its main pillars is people to people connections.

I firmly believe that the presence of bilingual schools such as SHPS is of paramount importance in creating a better understanding between different nations. Particularly in the context of Indonesia and Australia as close neighbours, the SHPS will contribute to the transformation of the relationship between the two countries beyond mere geographical proximity to becoming close friends and partners.

I, therefore, give my highest possible support to Scotts Head Public School in its ongoing and future efforts to secure support, including, but not limited to financial support from relevant authorities.
