Ricky Buchanan is heading to the United Nations on 12 July and will return on the 22 July. He will be attending the Expert Mechanism on the Rights of Indigenous People (EMRIP) Conference being held in the Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland.

He will be on a panel discussion with a few other Indigenous youth representatives from NSW. He will be talking about the UN Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous People (UNDRIP).

Ricky will be discussing the displacement of Indigenous people, recognition of Indigenous people, reparation, reconciliation, and Indigenous women in power. He will be talking about how the UNDRIP should be used within all of the countries within the UN and what is happening/not happening. This year's theme at the UN is Indigenous Languages so he will attempt to use language within their conversations.

A Successful Athletics Carnival

Despite a damp oval the Athletics Carnival was very successful. There was lots of mud and enthusiastic cheering from supporters. A great day was had by everyone!













Coastal Community Recycling is a Scotts Head based business for all residents and businesses in Scotts Head. Keeping our community clean and encouraging big multinational business to stop using plastics altogether.

You may have noticed our blue bins with yellow lids pop up around town for events such as World Ocean Day, Scotts Head Paddle Games, Zone Sports Carnivals, businesses and weekend soccer. These bins have taken the pressure off our sometimes overflowing smelly bins reducing the wind-blown litter in our busy times.

Coastal Community Recycling provides these bins for businesses and events free and does not charge for collection or sorting. 50% of all recycling money raised funds goes straight back into our community, school and clubs. Donations so far include \$500 to the Scotts Head Sports Committee, \$325 to the students at Scotts Head Primary School and \$145 to Scotts Surf Club.

Coastal Community is already working with Buz Brazel Park, Scotts Head Primary School, Scotts Hub, Scotts Head Surf Club, Club Scotts, The Friendly Grocer, Scotts Head Community Events, Christian Youth Centre and many more. We are now inviting all residents, clubs and business to join in raising funds for community projects.

We have easy-to-handle recycling crates available for all residents to start collecting recycling. It's simple, when full call the number on the crate and it will be collected and replaced with a new one free of charge with 50% of all money donated. At the moment we are only collecting glass bottles (including wine bottles), cans, plastic bottles and any items that have the 10 cent return symbol. This process is helping to ensure valuable resources are not going to landfill and raising much needed funds for Scotts Head.

A big thanks to all businesses who have helped Coastal Community Recycling get off the ground, especially Ritchie Donovan and Scotts Hub. A big thanks also to our first resident recyclers Wayne, Bart and others - we welcome everybody to join in. Our aim is to get into a commercial premises and purchase machinery to expand what we can recycle and keep our town pristine.




